

EXTENDED SYNOPSIS

Tony is a hot shot public servant deeply embedded in the Canberran way of life. Sent to the remote Aboriginal community of Gammon, his mission is to prepare the town for a visit by the Prime Minister, and to reveal the government's "brilliant plan" guaranteed to fix the Aboriginal Communities problem once and for all.

Upon arriving in the community, he is greeted by the straight shooting indomitable Mayor Neville and unveils his plan to hold auditions to find the best Welcome to Country act.

Unaware of the cultural faux pas he is committing, the auditions go ahead, bringing to light the best and the funniest elements of the community.





















WRITER & DIRECTOR | DEAN GIBSON

Dean Gibson is an Aboriginal filmmaker with more than 10 year's experience in creating, writing, directing, editing and producing. His work has screened on ABC3, ABC1, SBS and NITV and includes children's television, documentary and drama. He established Bacon Factory Films in 2013.

Much of Dean's broadcast highlights in the children's television space include directing two Sesame Street film *Five Kangaroos*, featuring Jessica Mauboy, and *The Recyclables* which have both screened to audiences all over the world. He also created and co-directed the children's' TV series *Handball Heroes*, which screened on ABC3.

In the documentary space, Dean co-directed the 50-minute feature documentary *A War of Hope*, which screened on NITV on ANZAC Day. He also created and directed the 50-minute ABC documentary, *From the Ashes*, following the Australian Indigenous cricket team as they toured the UK and discovered the history of Aboriginal cricket in Australia. Dean also co-created and ran a program for emerging Indigenous filmmakers in 2014, called *The Production Line*, as part of his passion for helping others to have opportunities in the industry. He is a creative, passionate and experienced filmmaker, who believes in the power of stories waiting to be told.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

The idea of bureaucracy meeting an Aboriginal community face to face is a concept I have thought about for many years. Through anecdotal accounts and personally witnessing the 'gap' between life in a city to a remote or regional community I have amassed so many stories. So to drop a staunch bureaucrat in a remote community to spar with a tough Mayor was where it started. I always wanted to package it in a comedy with heart so that it would reach broader audiences and some of the stories are so outrageous they hardly seem plausible so comedy is the answer. The good thing if it becomes a TV series we will never run out of episode ideas!



PRODUCER | HELEN MORRISON

Helen, Producer at Bent3Land Productions was born in the UK but raised in Queensland. In the last 10 years, Helen Morrison has produced or production managed over 60 hours of broadcast television. Helen has produced content for broadcast on ABC1, ABC2, ABC3, NITV and even Sesame Street *The Recyclables*. She has also produced two short documentaries for the International Jamie's (Oliver) Ministry of Food in Cherbourg and Mossman Gorge, Queensland for The Good Foundation.

In 2014 Helen co-created The Production Line with Dean Gibson a mentoring and filmmaking program for emerging Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander screen storytellers. Screen Queensland and Screen Australia as part of their Early Career Screen Program funded the Initiative.

Helen has a slate of projects in development, from feature films, documentaries to television series.

PRODUCER'S STATEMENT

Welcome to Country has been in my mind for over eight years when Dean Gibson mentioned he had an idea for Canberrian bureaucrats experiencing life in an Aboriginal community. The vision to make a comedy based on eyewitness accounts and anecdotes from Dean's ten year experience in regional and remote communities always felt like a compelling idea. The creation of a short film that neatly paints the sense of community and what connection to country means in a comedic package was our goal. To have the support of the Cherbourg Community made the film career authentic and true to loveable and wonderful characters we have met along our film journey. To have produced the short film of just one of those cringe worthy experiences and breaking down the barriers between city and country, us and them, bureaucracy and real life is just the beginning.

Since then, he has starred in numerous television and film productions, notably opposite Leah Purcell in the award-winning drama series *Redfern Now* on the ABC.

Alec conceptualised his first feature film *Zach's Ceremony* over a decade ago and released the film in 2016.

TONY ANDERSON | JOEL PIERCE

Joel Pierce completed his Bachelor of Arts majoring in Drama at the University of Pretoria (South Africa) and landed a lead role in a soap EGOLI where he performed in over 300 episodes before crossing the Atlantic to work in Australia. AUNTY ALICE | ROXANNE MCDONALD



SHOOTING LOCATION

THE COMMUNITY OF CHERBOURG

The history of Cherbourg is one of Aboriginal people being forcibly removed and brought from all over Queensland and Northern New South Wales to this newly formed government reserve. Under the Aborigines Protection Act of 1897 the settlement then called Barambah, was gazetted and established in 1904. In 1932, the name Barambah was then changed to Cherbourg due to a nearby property called "Barambah Station" which caused confusion in mail delivery.

Located 375km north west of Brisbane, Cherbourg covers 3,130 hectares DOGIT land and is within Wakka Wakka tribal boundaries and bordering onto Gubbi Gubbi (Kabi Kabi) territory to the east. The population is approximately 2000, however, as a result of the relocation of indigenous people under past government policies, residents of Cherbourg have connections to many other tribal groups throughout Queensland.

Since the mid to late 1960's, Cherbourg has always had an elected Aboriginal Council and it wasn't until the late 1980's, when changes took place and Cherbourg developed from being a welfare institution to a community. With the initiation of the Deed Of Grant InTrust (DOGIT), legislation was passed in 1982 and 1984 and Cherbourg started managing its own affairs.

This welcoming community was the perfect location for the film and the community was extremely supportive of the production.
